They both received their Bachelor degrees, Lynn graduated in Science and Physical Education and Glenna in Elementary and special Education. Eventually, they made the decision to move back to the ranch and help work as Glenna's father, Val Steele's health was deteriorating from wounds from WWII. Settling in Lago, they built a home and raised their children are Billy, Danny, Jared, Cami Taggart and Jeni Burr. They also became the proud grandparents to 17 grandkids. A favorite memory of the fair was when Alice Smith asked Lynn and Clinton Peck to be pick up men at the Little Buckaroo Rodeo, they did this for many years until it ended. They enjoyed supporting all five of their children picking out their steers out of their cattle herd in Diamond Creek and raising them to take them to the fair, they even had a few Grand Champions! They have also enjoyed watching their grandkids raising steers for the fair. They have loved to go support them and see old friends and make new ones! They wish to compliment the fair board on the outstanding job they do! It is an exhausting job and requires long hours of work. 

- E. All exhibits must remain on display from the time of entry to 4:00 p.m. Saturday.
- F. Decisions of the judges are final.
- G. The exhibits are to be limited to items made by, and owned by those who live within the boundaries of Caribou County school districts.

Bridle Path Hack (Hunt Seat):

- This class will be judged 60 percent on performance, 30 percent on conformation, and 10 percent on appointments at the discretion of the judge.
- Horses to be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. Horses to back readily in a straight line and stand quietly. Hand gallop at discretion of the judge.
- Horses are to be reversed to the inside (away from the rail). They may be required to reverse at the walk or trot at the discretion of the judge, but shall not be asked to reverse at the canter. Horses must be brought to flat-footed walk before changing gaits.
- Entries shall be shown with English snaffle (no shank), Pelham (with two reins), kimblewick and/or full bridle all with cavesson nosebands and plain leather browbands. Saddle hunting or forward seat; may have suede seat and/or suede insert on skirt.

Western Classes:

- Entries shall be shown with a stock saddle with good working equipment. There shall be no discrimination against any standard western bit. Horses may be ridden with snaffle, curb, spade, and bar bits or hackamore. Curb chain or straps may be used but must be at least 1/2 inch in width and lie flat against the jaws of the horse. No wire, twisted chain, tacks, or other metal may be used under the jaw or in the mouth, regardless of how padded or taped. No hackamore bits, easy stops, tie-down, tack collars or other equipment regarded as unsafe or inhumane, will be permitted.
- Horses are to be ridden astride in the ladies western pleasure, side saddle not acceptable tack for this class.
- The rider has option to the use of spurs, chaps, and carrying of rope, reata, slicker, and hobbles. Rider must be attired in western hat, long sleeve shirt, and boots.
- Horses may be ridden with either romal or split reins--except in classes where noted, reins will be held in
 one hand and cannot be changed during performance. Snaffle bit is a smooth bit with broken mouthpiece
 with a conventional O-ring, egg butt, or D-ring with ring no larger than 4 inches or smaller than 2 inches
 with an optional loose leather curb strap. Tom thumbs or long shank type snaffle are not acceptable in any
 snaffle bit class.
- Hackamore is only a rawhide or leather braided or rope bosal. Side pulls not accepted. Absolutely no iron
 will be permitted under the jaws regardless of how padded or taped.

PERFORMANCE RULES

Western Pleasure Classes:

• Open to horses of any breed or combination of breeds 14.1 hands and over normally used for pleasure to be shown at a walk, trot, lope, both ways of the ring, on a reasonable loose rein without undue restraint. Entries shall be penalized for being on the wrong lead. To be judged 60 percent performance, 30 percent on conformation, and 10 percent on appointments to enter.

Ranch Horse Pleasure:

• The ranch riding horse should simulate a horse riding outside the confines of the arena and reflect the versatility, attitude and movement of a working horse. The class is judged on the horse's ability to work at a forward, working speed, while performing the required and optional maneuvers. The required maneuvers are the walk, jog, and lope (both directions), the extended trot and extended lope at least one direction as well as stops, back and one change of direction. The optional maneuvers are side pass; turns of 360 degrees or more; change of lead (simple or flying); walk; jog or lope over poles or other reasonable maneuvers a ranch horse could perform.

Western Horsemanship:

• Western Horsemanship is designed to test horsemanship abilities of youth riders using western tack. It may be divided in two sections. Riders first follow a prescribed pattern of maneuvers at a walk, trot, or lope. Riders in walk, trot classes are not eligible for this class. Riders may be asked to ride as a group around the perimeter of the arena. Judging focuses on the rider's body position, seat in the saddle, and ability to control the horse.

Western Reining Classes:

- Horses will work a pattern and be scored on the basis of 60-80 points. Horses shall rein and handle easily with reasonable speed throughout the pattern.
- Horses to be ridden with two hands in a snaffle bit or hackamore designated class.
- Snaffle bit used as described in western classes.
- Horses will work individually. A judge may require any contestant to repeat their performance of any or all the various parts of the pattern. Horses will not be worked both ways of the ring on the rail.

The cow shall then be taken to the center of the arena and circled once each way. A new cow may be given to the rider if the judge feels the contestant is unable to show his or her horse to the best of its ability.
 - iIndividual cows will be worked within an allotted time of two (2) minutes with the contestant given a 30 second warning before time is up.
- E. The scoring of contestants shall be based on a scale from 60-80 points with 70 denoting an average performance. Half points may be used for performance only. Points scored for reined work and the cattle work(s) are to be totaled. In the event of a tie, the entry with the highest cattle work score shall win.



- H. You must specify whether your produce was greenhouse grown or garden grown, they will be judged accordingly.
- I. Youth (17 or younger) entries are welcome and will be judged separately. The same rules will apply.

POINTS OF JUDGING

1. Entries will be judged on uniformity, trueness of type, freedom from defects and good <u>edible</u> <u>qualities.</u>
